- We take great pride in our hugely popular Rainbow Badge Initiative. Staff members who submit a pledge of their support of LGBT+ people within the Trust receive a Rainbow NHS badge. This badge lets LGBT+ staff and patients know they have an ally close at hand.
- In addition to our badges we now have Co-Chairs In post that have been selected by and from our own members. While we still have HR support, we now more than ever, have autonomy. This means more control over our future has been placed within the capable hands of the Network.
